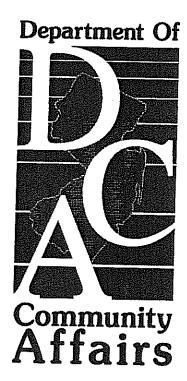

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget for the South Brunswick Fire District No. 2 (the "Fire District") for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2017 and ending December 31, 2017 has been presented before the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District at its open public meeting of December 5, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the budget as introduced is in compliance with the Property Tax Levy Cap Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.44 et. seq.);and

Total proposed appropriations of \$1,240,653 represent an increase of \$79,267 (+6.8%) over the 2016 adopted budget. Total Capital Appropriations are higher by \$173,178 (+115.5%) to support the replacement of a pumper truck approved by the voters in 2015. Debt Service is lower by \$92,755 (-47.3%) due to the retirement of general obligation bonds. The amount to be raised by taxation of \$940,475 is the same as the 2016 adopted budget due primarily to additional fund balance utilization of \$78,517.

Other significant line items with a +/-10% variance are as follows:

<u>Administrative Fringe Benefits</u> – Increase of \$6,446 (+11.4%) is primarily due to a provision for an overall 15% increase in health insurance premiums.

<u>Length of Service Award Program (LOSAP)</u> – Decrease of \$6,272 (-12.4%) reflects a lower participation rate than budgeted in 2016.

As stated in #1 above, the amount to be raised by taxation is the same as the current year's adopted budget resulting in an expected tax rate of .046 cents per hundred of dollars of assessed valuation – the same as realized in 2016. There is no anticipated significant impact on the following year's budget due to the use of \$108,950 of unreserved fund balance in the proposed Annual Budget as there remains a projected balance of \$345,448. The district's current outlook for 2018 anticipates the availability and utilization of \$140,281 of unreserved fund balance and a stable tax rate.

The District is in compliance with the Levy Cap Statute and therefore will not be proposing any referendum to exceed the cap limit.

Capital Appropriations for 2017 are \$323,178 of which \$137,930 will be reserved for future capital outlays. A capital project of \$850,000 for the replacement of a pumper truck which received voter approval in 2015 is being funded by a combination of a lease/purchase and use of Restricted Fund Balance. Total debt service of \$103,346 for 2017 is \$92,755 lower than the current year budget and is expected to remain at about that level for at least the next several years.

Following the hiring, the Board of Fire Commissioners received a verbal ruling from the Department of Community Affairs stating that it was permitted for Charles Smith to sit on the Board provided he does not participate in any discussions regarding personnel matters or salary and wages/benefits regarding the District Coordinator's position.

Charles Smith was re-elected to the office of Fire Commissioner in March 2012. Since his return, Commissioner Smith has excused himself from all executive session discussions pertaining to the employment of the District Coordinator.

- Officer: A person elected or appointed to manage the Fire District's daily operations at any time during the year, such as the chairperson, vice-chairperson, secretary, or treasurer. For the purposes of this schedule, treat the Fire District's top management official and top financial official as officers, if applicable. A member of the governing body may be both a commissioner and an officer for the purposes of this schedule.

This agreement is made this <u>21st</u> day of <u>November</u>, <u>2016</u> by and between the COMMISSIONERS OF FIRE DISTRICT NO. 2, in the Township of SOUTH BRUNSWICK, MIDDLESEX COUNTY (herein referred to as COMMISSIONERS); and the MONMOUTH JUNCTION VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT (herein referred to as the FIRE DEPARTMENT).

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A., 40A:14-70.1(b) authorizes the COMMISSIONERS of a fire district to contract with a volunteer fire company or companies for the purpose of extinguishing fires, upon those terms and conditions as shall be deemed proper; and

WHEREAS, the COMMISSIONERS have negotiated an agreement with the FIRE DEPARTMENT within their jurisdiction upon terms that are fair and proper for the providing of fire protection services to the fire district;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed, in consideration of the payment to be made as herein described and the exchange of mutual promises, as follows:

- The term of this agreement shall run from January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2019.
- 2. The FIRE DEPARTMENT will extinguish fires within the fire district or within such other areas or territories as may be contracted for by the COMMISSIONERS and FIRE DEPARTMENT or pursuant to mutual aid agreements which have been approved by the COMMISSIONERS and the FIRE DEPARTMENT. For purposes hereof, the term "extinguishing fires" shall be used in its broadest and most universal sense.
- Nothing herein shall be construed to increase any liability on the part of the FIRE DEPARTMENT to the public for errors or omissions in the performance or non-performance of its duties hereunder, or pursuant to any other requirement.
- 4. The members of the FIRE DEPARTMENT, in performing fire duties and related activities, shall be deemed to be exercising a governmental function.
- The members of the FIRE DEPARTMENT shall be under the supervision and control of the COMMISSIONERS, and the FIRE DEPARTMENT may not take any action which is contrary to law.

- The FIRE DEPARTMENT shall perform such other duties, directly or indirectly related to the extinguishment of fires and rescue as may reasonably be assigned from time to time by the COMMISSIONERS.
- 7. In addition to the payment to be made by the COMMISSIONERS to the FIRE DEPARTMENT pursuant to this agreement, the COMMISSIONERS shall provide worker's compensation coverage for all firefighters of the FIRE DEPARTMENT and liability insurance coverage for the FIRE DEPARTMENT and its apparatus, vehicles and equipment as approved by the COMMISSIONERS.
- 8. The COMMISSIONERS shall also carry a special Group Life Insurance Policy that provides life insurance in the amount of \$25,000.00 for each member who meets the requirements as prescribed in the Policy and Procedures Manual. As the \$25,000.00 is set by NJ State Statutes, any increase approved by the legislators will be considered by the COMMISSIONERS for qualified firefighters. COMMISSIONERS approved increases or changes will be included in that section of the Policy and Procedures Manual.
- 9. The COMMISSIONERS shall reimburse firefighters for any losses incurred while engaged in fire duty, subject to reasonable proof of such losses in accordance with procedures to be established by the COMMISSIONERS except for those losses or expenses for which reimbursement shall be covered by insurance. Payment for losses shall not exceed those monies provided for such purposes within the adopted budget.
- 10. The COMMISSIONERS shall provide an annual clothing allowance in the amount of \$350.00 for those members who meet the requirements as prescribed in the Policy and Procedures Manual.
- 11. The COMMISSIONERS shall provide Length of Service Award Program (LOSAP) contributions to those FIRE DEPARTMENT volunteers who meet the requirements as spelled out in the Policy and Procedures Manual at a rate of \$1,669.00 for the 2016 contribution. Each year after 2016 the COMMISSIONERS will give consideration to the Cost of Living Increase (COLI) for the current year, as set by the State of N.J. This increase, if deemed appropriate by the COMMISSIONERS, will be applied to the previous year's LOSAP contribution.

- 12. Not withstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, the COMMISSIONERS will exercise jurisdiction over the FIRE DEPARTMENT in firematic matters only and will not interfere or seek to regulate the internal administration of the FIRE DEPARTMENT. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to authorize the COMMISSIONERS to direct the actions of fire officials or firefighters at the scene or to act contrary to statutory command authority of the Fire Chief at the fire scene pursuant to 40A:14-70.1.
- 13. The COMMISSIONERS shall not contract with any other municipality or fire district for the extinguishment of fires, no mutual aid agreement and no rule or regulation or by-law relating thereto may be adopted without furnishing the FIRE DEPARTMENT in advance, an opportunity for hearing and discussion.
- 14. The FIRE DEPARTMENT will house, if applicable, any apparatus, vehicles or equipment furnished by the COMMISSIONERS in a safe and secure manner. The FIRE DEPARTMENT will observe any rules or regulations promulgated by the COMMISSIONERS, for the maintenance, storage and use of said apparatus, vehicles and equipment and shall utilize same in accordance with procedures established by the COMMISSIONERS to effectuate the purposes of this agreement.
- 15. The FIRE DEPARTMENT may not hire or employ any person to perform any firematic function for the FIRE DEPARTMENT without the consent of the COMMISSIONERS, which shall not be unreasonably held. The COMMISSIONERS may provide paid employees, provided that the requirements of L.1979,c.453 and N.J.S.A. 40A:14-81.1 and subsequent amendments, if any, are observed.
- 16. The COMMISSIONERS will pay to the FIRE DEPARTMENT the sum of \$40,000.00 for the period from January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017, a sum of \$41,000.00 for the period from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018, and \$42,000.00 for the period from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019. The COMMISSIONERS shall make payment to the FIRE DEPARTMENT in equal quarterly installments for services provided hereunder which services shall include, but not be limited to, firematic matters, and the maintenance and operation of the FIRE DEPARTMENT. Payments will be made no later than three business days following the COMMISSIONERS regular meeting schedule for the months of March, June, August, and November. The COMMISSIONERS shall require submission of a voucher as a prerequisite to payment.

- 17. This agreement is contingent upon adequate funding being provided in the budget as approved by the taxpayers, or if the budget be defeated at the annual election, adequate funding being left in place by the South Brunswick Township Municipal Council. If adequate funding is not provided, this agreement shall be voidable at the discretion of either party.
- 18. The terms of this agreement shall not be modified except by written agreement of the parties. Notice of negotiation for a successor agreement shall be served by August 31, 2019 by either party to the other. If notice to negotiate is not provided, or the parties are unable to reach agreement prior to the expiration date, the contract shall continue in full force and effect on a month to month basis until a new agreement in concluded or either party provides 30 days notice of termination.
- 19. If any article, section, paragraph, sentence or clause of this agreement is determined to be invalid, same shall be deemed severable and the remainder of the agreement shall survive unless such invalidation language is material to the purposes and intentions of this agreement.
- 20. The COMMISSIONERS agree to indemnify, hold harmless and provide a defense to any lawsuit brought against any member of the FIRE DEPARTMENT arising out of the performance of the obligations in this agreement. Those terms and conditions are subject to the terms and conditions imposed by the District Insurance Carrier under those policies titled Errors and Omissions.
- 21. The COMMISSIONERS for the term of the contract agree to continue to provide direct payment for the following expenses related to the Dayton Annex Building (STATION 21), located at 481 Georges Road, Dayton, New Jersey. It is also understood and agreed that the COMMISSIONERS will work together with the Trustees of the FIRE DEPARTMENT to solicit, advertise, and monitor the performance of contracts awarded by the COMMISSIONERS for the following:
 - a. Property and building insurance coverage.
 - b. Interior cleaning and janitorial maintenance.
 - c. Grounds maintenance and lawn care.
 - d. Utilities (telephone, water and sewer, electric and gas).
 - e. Interior and Exterior repairs, maintenance, improvements and a upgrades.
- 22. To ensure accurate and proper accounting principles and procedure methods are being utilized and performed, the FIRE DEPARTMENT shall be required
