Such amount shall be equal to the amount of the total appropriations set forth in the budget minus the total amount surplus and miscellaneous revenues set forth in the budget; and

WHEREAS, in calculating the amount to be raised by taxation, the Fire District has taken into account the assessed valuation of taxable property in the Fire District;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District, at an open public meeting held on December 7, 2020 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, of the Fire District for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2021 is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the Fire District's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and

Department of Community Affairs stating that it was permitted for Commissioner Smith to sit on the Board provided that he does not
participate in any discussions or vote on any personnel matters regarding salary and wages/benefits regarding the District Coordinator's
position. Commissioner Smith was re-elected to the office of Fire Commissioner in February 2012 and has served again on the Board since
March 2012 until the present time. Since his return, Commissioner Smith has excused himself from all open and executive session
discussions or votes pertaining to the employment of the District Coordinator.
4b. Anne Chibbaro and Patricia Wolfe were each paid \$120 as poll workers for the annual district election and are the sister-in-law and wife,
respectively, of Commissioner Douglas Wolfe.
5g. Both Chief Smith & Deputy Chief Wert are permitted the use of a chief's vehicle so as to be available to respond directly to any
emergency calls that may arise on a 24/7 basis.



#### AGREEMENT

This agreement is made this 18<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2019 by and between the COMMISSIONERS OF FIRE DISTRICT NO. 2, in the Township of SOUTH BRUNSWICK, MIDDLESEX COUNTY (herein referred to as COMMISSIONERS); and the MONMOUTH JUNCTION VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT (herein referred to as the FIRE DEPARTMENT).

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A., 40A:14-70.1(b) authorizes the COMMISSIONERS of a fire district to contract with a volunteer fire company or companies for the purpose of extinguishing fires, upon those terms and conditions as shall be deemed proper; and

WHEREAS, the COMMISSIONERS have negotiated an agreement with the FIRE DEPARTMENT within their jurisdiction upon terms that are fair and proper for the providing of fire protection services to the fire district;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed, in consideration of the payment to be made as herein described and the exchange of mutual promises, as follows:

- 1. The term of this agreement shall run from January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022.
- 2. The FIRE DEPARTMENT will extinguish fires within the fire district or within such other areas or territories as may be contracted for by the COMMISSIONERS and FIRE DEPARTMENT or pursuant to mutual aid agreements which have been approved by the COMMISSIONERS and the FIRE DEPARTMENT. For purposes hereof, the term "extinguishing fires" shall be used in its broadest and most universal sense.
- Nothing herein shall be construed to increase any liability on the part of the FIRE DEPARTMENT to the public for errors or omissions in the performance or non-performance of its duties hereunder, or pursuant to any other requirement.
- The members of the FIRE DEPARTMENT, in performing fire duties and related activities, shall be deemed to be exercising a governmental function.
- The members of the FIRE DEPARTMENT shall be under the supervision and control of the COMMISSIONERS, and the FIRE DEPARTMENT may not take any action which is contrary to law.

- The FIRE DEPARTMENT shall perform such other duties, directly or indirectly related to the extinguishment of fires and rescue as may reasonably be assigned from time to time by the COMMISSIONERS.
- 7. In addition to the payment to be made by the COMMISSIONERS to the FIRE DEPARTMENT pursuant to this agreement, the COMMISSIONERS shall provide worker's compensation coverage for all firefighters of the FIRE DEPARTMENT and liability insurance coverage for the FIRE DEPARTMENT and its apparatus, vehicles and equipment as approved by the COMMISSIONERS.
- 8. The COMMISSIONERS shall also carry a special Group Life Insurance Policy that provides life insurance in the amount of \$25,000.00 for each member who meets the requirements as prescribed in the Policy and Procedures Manual. As the \$25,000.00 is set by NJ State Statutes, any increase approved by the legislators will be considered by the COMMISSIONERS for qualified firefighters. COMMISSIONERS approved increases or changes will be included in that section of the Policy and Procedures Manual.
- 9. The COMMISSIONERS shall reimburse firefighters for any losses incurred while engaged in fire duty, subject to reasonable proof of such losses in accordance with procedures to be established by the COMMISSIONERS except for those losses or expenses for which reimbursement shall be covered by insurance. Payment for losses shall not exceed those monies provided for such purposes within the adopted budget.
- 10. The COMMISSIONERS shall provide an annual clothing allowance in the amount of \$375.00 for those members who meet the requirements as prescribed in the Policy and Procedures Manual.
- 11. The COMMISSIONERS shall provide Length of Service Award Program (LOSAP) contributions to those FIRE DEPARTMENT volunteers who meet the requirements as spelled out in the Policy and Procedures Manual at a rate of \$1,717.00 for the 2019 contribution. Each year after 2019 the COMMISSIONERS will give consideration to the Cost of Living Increase (COLI) for the current year, as set by the State of N.J. This increase, if deemed appropriate by the COMMISSIONERS, will be applied to the previous year's LOSAP contribution.

- 12. Not withstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, the COMMISSIONERS will exercise jurisdiction over the FIRE DEPARTMENT in firematic matters only and will not interfere or seek to regulate the internal administration of the FIRE DEPARTMENT. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to authorize the COMMISSIONERS to direct the actions of fire officials or firefighters at the scene or to act contrary to statutory command authority of the Fire Chief at the fire scene pursuant to 40A:14-70.1.
- 13. The COMMISSIONERS shall not contract with any other municipality or fire district for the extinguishment of fires, no mutual aid agreement and no rule or regulation or by-law relating thereto may be adopted without furnishing the FIRE DEPARTMENT in advance, an opportunity for hearing and discussion.
- 14. The FIRE DEPARTMENT will house, if applicable, any apparatus, vehicles or equipment furnished by the COMMISSIONERS in a safe and secure manner. The FIRE DEPARTMENT will observe any rules or regulations promulgated by the COMMISSIONERS, for the maintenance, storage and use of said apparatus, vehicles and equipment and shall utilize same in accordance with procedures established by the COMMISSIONERS to effectuate the purposes of this agreement.
- 15. The FIRE DEPARTMENT may not hire or employ any person to perform any firematic function for the FIRE DEPARTMENT without the consent of the COMMISSIONERS, which shall not be unreasonably held. The COMMISSIONERS may provide paid employees, provided that the requirements of L.1979,c.453 and N.J.S.A. 40A:14-81.1 and subsequent amendments, if any, are observed.
- 16. The COMMISSIONERS will pay to the FIRE DEPARTMENT the sum of \$42,840.00 for the period from January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020, a sum of \$43,700.00 for the period from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021, and \$44,600.00 for the period from January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022. The COMMISSIONERS shall make payment to the FIRE DEPARTMENT in equal quarterly installments for services provided hereunder which services shall include, but not be limited to, firematic matters, and the maintenance and operation of the FIRE DEPARTMENT. Payments will be made no later than three business days following the COMMISSIONERS regular meeting schedule for the months of March, June, August, and November. The COMMISSIONERS shall require submission of a voucher as a prerequisite to payment.

- 17. This agreement is contingent upon adequate funding being provided in the budget as approved by the taxpayers, or if the budget be defeated at the annual election, adequate funding being left in place by the South Brunswick Township Municipal Council. If adequate funding is not provided, this agreement shall be voidable at the discretion of either party.
- 18. The terms of this agreement shall not be modified except by written agreement of the parties. Notice of negotiation for a successor agreement shall be served by August 31, 2022 by either party to the other. If notice to negotiate is not provided, or the parties are unable to reach agreement prior to the expiration date, the contract shall continue in full force and effect on a month to month basis until a new agreement in concluded or either party provides 30 days notice of termination.
- 19. If any article, section, paragraph, sentence or clause of this agreement is determined to be invalid, same shall be deemed severable and the remainder of the agreement shall survive unless such invalidation language is material to the purposes and intentions of this agreement.
- 20. The COMMISSIONERS agree to indemnify, hold harmless and provide a defense to any lawsuit brought against any member of the FIRE DEPARTMENT arising out of the performance of the obligations in this agreement. Those terms and conditions are subject to the terms and conditions imposed by the District Insurance Carrier under those policies titled Errors and Omissions.
- 21. The COMMISSIONERS for the term of the contract agree to continue to provide direct payment for the following expenses related to the Dayton Annex Building (STATION 21), located at 481 Georges Road, Dayton, New Jersey. It is also understood and agreed that the COMMISSIONERS will work together with the Trustees of the FIRE DEPARTMENT to solicit, advertise, and monitor the performance of contracts awarded by the COMMISSIONERS for the following:
  - a. Property and building insurance coverage.
  - b. Interior cleaning and janitorial maintenance.
  - c. Grounds maintenance and lawn care.
  - d. Utilities (telephone, water and sewer, electric and gas).
  - Interior and Exterior repairs, maintenance, improvements and upgrades.
- 22. To ensure accurate and proper accounting principles and procedure methods are being utilized and performed, the FIRE DEPARTMENT shall be required

to have an annual financial disclosure completed by an outside certified public accountant. Upon completion of said financial disclosure, a signed copy of the independent accountant's review report letter will be furnished to the COMMISSIONERS. Such letter shall be provided to the COMMISSIONERS no later than September 30th following the close of each fiscal year.

#### FIRST AID AGREEMENT

This agreement made this 16th day of December 2019,

BETWEEN: The Commissioners of Fire District #2 in the Township of South Brunswick,

County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as "District"

AND: The Monmouth Junction First Aid Squad, hereinafter referred to as "Squad."

1. District is a fire district organized pursuant to the laws of the State of New Jersey for the purpose of providing fire protection services to the residents of the area of Fire District #2 in South Brunswick Township, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey.

- 2. Squad is a volunteer first aid squad organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey.
- 3. District desires to have an ambulance and qualified crew accompany the Monmouth Junction Volunteer Fire Department on all alarms within Fire District #2.
- 4. Squad is willing to undertake the obligations of attending the Monmouth Junction Volunteer Fire Department on all calls within Fire District #2.
- 5. For the aforesaid services rendered to the Commissioners, Commissioners agree to compensate Squad for the calendar year ending December 31, 2020 at the rate of \$11,800.00, for the calendar year ending December 31, 2021 at the rate of \$12,000.00, and for the calendar year ending December 31, 2022 at the rate of \$12,250.00. Payments will be made in a lump sum during the month of December for each calendar year.
- Squad shall be responsible for workers compensation and all other health and accident
  insurance and liability protection for its members and shall furnish proof of same to District
  upon request but at least once a year.
- 7. The term of this agreement shall run for three years, from <u>January 1, 2020</u> through December 31, 2022, renewing itself automatically if neither party notifies the other of its intention to terminate or re-negotiate the agreement by December 1, 2022, providing that either party may terminate this agreement without penalty and without just cause upon 60 days prior written notice.
- This agreement shall supersede any prior or existing agreements, written or oral, expressed or implied.
- Any notices to be provided hereunder shall be directed to the Clerk of District or Secretary of Squad.
- 10. This agreement shall become effective upon approval by Resolution by each of the parties and execution by the President and Chairman respectively of Squad and District and attestation respectively by the Secretary and Clerk. Executed copy of this agreement shall constitute an original.

#### SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH BRUNSWICK AND SOUTH BRUNSWICK FIRE DISTRICT #2 FOR DEPUTY FIRE MARSHAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made the AOM day of November, 2017, by and between the TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH BRUNSWICK, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, having its principal place of business at P.O. Box 190, 540 Ridge Road Monmouth Junction, New Jersey 08852, ("TOWNSHIP"), and SOUTH BRUNSWICK FIRE DISTRICT #2, having its principal place of business at P.O. Box 114, 573 Ridge Road, Monmouth Junction, NJ 08852, ("FIRE DISTRICT").

#### WITNESSETH as follows:

- 1) BASIC SERVICES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT. The TOWNSHIP will retain four (4) full time Deputy Fire Marshals as direct employees of the TOWNSHIP, who shall receive all of the salary and benefits applicable to that position. The total number of full time Deputy Fire Marshals shall remain at four (4) for at least the initial term of this agreement.
- 2) **ADDITIONAL SERVICES.** In addition to the Basic Services set forth above, the following shall apply:
  - a) The TOWNSHIP shall allow one (1) Deputy Fire Marshal ("Deputy Fire Marshal") to remain at the FIRE DISTRICT's disposal for not more than ten (10) days per calendar year.
  - b) The Deputy Fire Marshal, even when at the disposal of the FIRE DISTRICT, shall perform no services other than the duties prescribed for the position of Deputy Fire Marshal as set forth in the applicable job description established by the TOWNSHIP.

#### 3) PAYMENTS; CREDITS.

- a) FIRE DISTRICT agrees to reimburse the TOWNSHIP for all expected costs and expenses associated with one (1) Deputy Fire Marshal, including, but not limited to, cost of salary, wages, medical, dental and pension benefits, taxes and fees. Total reimbursement to the Township by Fire District #2 will be eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000.00) annually, payable in four equal payments of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) each, on the last day of March, June, September and December of each year that this agreement is in force.
- b) Should the number of four (4) Deputy Fire Marshals be reduced for any period of ten (10) consecutive business days or more, where the employee is not being compensated, the TOWNSHIP then agrees to credit FIRE DISTRICT at the rate of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per business day. It is also understood the TOWNSHIP will make every effort to maintain Deputy Fire Marshal staffing levels at four (4) should a permanent vacancy occur that is beyond either of the parties' control.
- c) TOWNSHIP and FIRE DISTRICT will review, on or after December 1, of each year this agreement remains in effect, the additional revenue stream derived from life hazard inspections performed by Deputy Fire Marshal. The purpose of this review is to set a possible base line for credits to FIRE DISTRICT based on total cost to fund the fire operations and the total revenue derived from same. Fire District #2 shall also have the right to review Fire Safety Operations and productivity on a monthly basis, if so requested.

#### 4) TERM; RENEWAL; TERMINATION.

a) The term of this agreement shall be three (3) years, said time to be measured from January 1, 2018, it being the parties' intention that this agreement, and any renewals thereof, shall commence and terminate on a calendar year basis.

- b) The TOWNSHIP and the FIRE DISTRICT represent that their governing bodies have adopted the appropriate resolution, pursuant to N. J. S. A. 40:8A-1, et seq., to authorize execution of this agreement.
- c) This agreement may be renewed for additional three (3) year terms. Notice of FIRE DISTRICT's desire to renew shall be given to the TOWNSHIP in writing not later than October 1 of the year in which the agreement term expires. The TOWNSHIP shall notify the FIRE DISTRICT in writing by November 1 of that year of the TOWNSHIP's intention to renew or terminate.
- d) Any one of the following shall constitute an event of termination of this agreement:
  - 1) Expiration of the agreement without timely notice to renew.
  - Excessive non-payment or late payment by the FIRE DISTRICT, as determined by the TOWNSHIP.
- e) With the exception of normal expiration of this agreement, the FIRE DISTRICT shall give TOWNSHIP thirty (30) days written notice of its intent to terminate.
- INDEMNIFICATION OF THE TOWNSHIP. The TOWNSHIP shall and hereby does agree to protect and save the FIRE DISTRICT harmless against any and all losses or damage suffered by the FIRE DISTRICT as a result of this agreement, and shall indemnify and does indemnify FIRE DISTRICT of and from all liability, claims and demands whatsoever arising from this agreement, and growing out of any cause, claim and demand whatsoever during the term of this agreement, and any renewals thereof that arise as of a result of any action or inaction of the Deputy Fire Marshal in the lawful exercise of his duties. This indemnification shall not apply to any action or inaction of the Deputy Fire Marshal that is unlawful or that has been undertaken as a result of specific direction given to the Deputy Fire Marshal by the FIRE DISTRICT that constitute activities that are outside the scope of the Deputy Fire Marshal's normal duties for the TOWNSHIP.
- 6) NOTICE. All notices required by the terms of this agreement shall be given in writing by personal delivery, certified mail with return receipt requested, or fax transmission, except that fax transmission shall not be effective unless the original is received by the addressee within 48 hours. Notices shall be sent or delivered to the parties at the addresses set forth herein, with copies to counsel for the parties (if any).
- 7) NO ASSIGNMENT. Neither this agreement, nor any right or interest hereunder, shall be assigned by the FIRE DISTRICT in any respect whatsoever.
- 8) GOVERNING LAW. This agreement shall be deemed to have been executed and entered into in the State of New Jersey and shall be construed, enforced and performed in accordance with the laws thereof. The parties agree to submit themselves to the jurisdiction of the New Jersey Superior Court, with venue placed in Middlesex County.
- 9) ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This agreement contains all of the agreements between the parties. No other statements, proposals or agreements, oral or written, shall be binding upon either party with regard to the subject matter of this agreement.
- 10) FIRE DISTRICT REAP OBLIGATION. FIRE DISTRICT shall file all necessary documents, applications, statements, verification forms, etc., as may be necessary pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-8.76, et seq., the "Regional Efficiency Aid Program Act" so that shared services credit, naming TOWNSHIP as the provider of the within regional service agreement can be obtained.
